Homeless Veterans

Background: This year State Commander Daniel Kell has chosen Homeless Veterans as his Special Project. Since Past State Commanders Dennis Sullivan, Michael Burke and Thomas Howard's efforts to help reduce the Veteran homeless population, our veterans continue to experience homelessness in record numbers.

Although flawless counts are impossible to come by – the transient nature of homeless populations presents a major difficulty. In 2023 the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD)estimates that 35,574 veterans are homeless on any given night. Veterans Affairs estimated that there were 76,000 veterans sleeping in the streets and increasing. This reflects a 7.4% increase in the number in the number of veterans experiencing homelessness from 2022. Despite the increases there is still an overall downward trend in veteran homelessness. In 2023 there was 3,126 to 3,980 homeless female veterans and on the rise. Veterans spend an average of six years homeless. Research shows that the greatest risk factor for homelessness are lack of support and social isolation after discharge.

Homeless veterans include those having served in World War II, Korea, Vietnam, Grenada, Panama, Lebanon, Afghanistan, and Irag and other locations around the world.
