The year has been, to say the least, very tough and difficult but we've done an amazing job getting through it. One by one the snags which have caused hiccups in our daily activities were



When Posts close or have their charters revoked, much of the value of these posts would be saved if they filed for a change of by-laws and a deed modification.

That solution could be accomplished by putting a clause in their deed that states, 'that upon a Post Charter cancellation the real estate automatically reverts to the Department of New York." All Posts should amend their deeds to reflect this advice, so the department doesn't have to expend unnecessary expense and time resolving ownership.

Without it, we must chase down remaining Post Commanders to have them execute affidavits and deeds. It is further complicated when many Posts were first organized, bought property, and took title not in the Post name but in the name of a "separately created corporation." After all those years have passed and the original corporate officers have passed away, we now have quite a problem on our hands. I have been dealing with that issue by asserting that the corporate intent was that the annual Post Commanders and officers were the successors to the corporate officers so we have to have additional documents signed by them as "corporate representatives". Also, many post commanders think that upon disbanding, the remaining members can sell the property and split the proceeds among themselves as surviving members of the corporations. That assumption is erroneous and could very well be illegal.

I have been in contact with the VA Hospitals and Veteran Nursing homes on a periodic basis. On each of the VA Websites, information is updated periodically on the COVID-19 status and currently the VA has tested 3,477,832 veterans and employees for COVID-19 of which the VA has diagnosed 254,688 with

COVID-19 as of 30 April 2021. To date as of 30 April 2021 VA has administered 2,545,825 Veterans and 306,316 Employees with at least one dose of the vaccine. This report is updated weekly on the VA website.

Congress has passed a new law that allows us to offer COVID-19 vaccines to more people. VA is now able to offer vaccine to the following groups who are eligible for a COVID-19 vaccine at VA when their local VA facilities have enough vaccine:

- Veterans
- · Spouse of a Veteran
- Caregivers of a Veteran
- Recipients of Civilian Health and Medical Program of the Department of Veterans Affairs (CHAMPVA) benefits
- We are seeing a decline of COVID-19 cases in certain areas of New York and we need to continue to do the following:

VA is providing the Pfizer-BioNTech, Moderna, and Johnson & Johnson (Janssen) vaccines, as authorized by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA). Supply varies by facility. VA is resuming offering the Johnson & Johnson (Janssen) COVID-19 vaccine to individuals 18 years and older.

We need to continue to follow the guidelines set forth by the Governor's mandates and Department of New York. Information on Covid-19 continues to be passed down on a daily basis by the Department of New York to be passed on to the posts in the Districts.

- (1) Use of masks to help slow down the spread of COVID-19 and observing social distancing 6 feet in public
- (2) Wash your hands often
- (3) Avoid close contact
- (4) Cover coughs and sneezes
- (5) Clean and disinfect frequently used spaces

Covid-19 Virus Vaccines are being distributed and our VA Hospitals are doing a great job taking care of our veterans, family and employees by contacting them and setting up times to provide them their COVID-19 vaccination.

Our National Surgeon Renee Simpson continues to hold virtual Zoom meetings on the 1st Saturday of each month with all the Department Surgeons to discuss issues and concerns while dealing with the COVID-19 pandemic and how we can better serve our Comrades, veterans and families.

As we continue to battle COVID-19 let's continue to be safe and keep healthy!!

Gurtler Brothers VFW Post 420 Celebrates Its 100th Anniversary

Gurtler Brothers Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 420 celebrated its 100th Anniversary on May 22, 2021 after having been delayed twice as the result of the COVID 19 pandemic. The post was chartered and mustered on May 24, 1910 with thirty veterans who had served in the Spanish-American War, Mexican Border War or World War I. The officers of the Post were elected and installed by Chief of Staff S. Pemburn from National Headquarters.

The first Post Commander was Frank B. Howe, Jr. who served with Co. K, 105th Infantry, 27th Division in Europe during World War I. Senior Vice-Commander Alermon F. White, Jr. Vice Commander Michael J. Abbott, Quartermaster James W. Grooms, Chaplain Richard J. Sherman, Surgeon Dr. Frederick G. Eaton and Officer of the Day Harley B. Crippen were also installed in office.

The Saratoga Post is named in memory of Saratoga Springs, New York brothers, Corporal William Gurtler, age 26 and Private George H. Gurtler, Jr., age 21. Both served with Co. L, 2nd N.Y. Infantry, U.S. National Guard in Mexican Border Service (1916) and with Headquarters Co., 105th Infantry, 27th Division in World War I. Both brothers were killed in action on October 20, 1918 in the Battle of the Selle. The Armistice was declared less than a month later, on November 11.

The brothers were buried side-by-side in the Somme American Cemetery at Bony, Aisne (pronounced "N"), in Northern France near where they fell in battle. A memorial marker was also erected in Greenridge Cemetery in Saratoga Springs in memory of the two brothers. In 1930, Bertha Gurtler participated in a federal "Gold Star Mothers" program that paid expenses of mothers wishing to travel to the graves of their children overseas.

The brothers' path had rarely diverged, both having enlisted in the National Guard in early 1916 and having served in the Mexican Borders Campaign of the same year. Serving together was a source of strength, as George Gurtler assured his parents in August of 1918. "We have been through a lot of war and after all that we have been through," he wrote, "there is nothing that we could not endure or face now, I believe." George Sr. and Bertha Gurtler received the final letters from their two sons on the very same day as was reported in The Saratogian newspaper.

Following World War I their nephew, William P. Kelly – son of James and Bertha Gurtler Kelly, served with the Royal Canadian Air Force and the U.S. Army Air Corps during the "Battle of Britain" as a fighter pilot. William was lost over the North Sea on February 5, 1943.

The Post has held meetings since 1920 at the Spanish-American War Veterans Hall on Pavilion Place, the Armory on Lake Avenue, the Saratoga Veterans Home on Broadway and at VFW Post Homes on East Van Dam Street and High Rock Avenue before building its present Post Home on the corner of Excelsior Avenue and Veterans Way in 1975.

Gurtler Brothers VFW Post membership is presently over 400 veterans whose eligibility is dependent on overseas service which resulted in the award of a Campaign Service Medal or Expeditionary Medal. The Post also has an active Auxiliary of over 100 members.

In 2019 Gurtler Brothers was recognized by the VFW National Commander B.J. Lawrence as an All-American Post - a first time achievement for Post 420 since its inception.


