Greetings Comrades;

As we approach the end of the year the Department of New York is continuing to move forward as we strive to reach our goals set forth in all categories set forth by National.

We are continuing to do a great in Membership this year, currently Department of New York is at 88.24% as of December 8, 2023, working toward to achieving our goal of 102% by 30 June 2024. As a reminder, Commander-in-Chief Duane Sarmiento has issued a challenge to all the Department Commanders with a Department Membership Challenge and will award the Department of New York \$2,750 for each of the following membership goals for a total of \$11,000. These funds if the goals are met will be added to the Department Membership Budget and will be available to assist the Department, District and Posts with their recruiting events:

88% Membership by November 1, 2023 - \$2750.00 (Did not make)

95% Membership by February 1, 2024 - \$2750.00

99% Membership by May 31, 2024 - \$2750.00

102% Membership by June 30, 2024 - \$2750.00

The Department of New York came close to achieving the November 1st, 2023, goal of 88% and only missed it by 460 members, New or Re-instated.

I want to take this time and thank the Districts and the post for meeting and excelling in the Commander-In-Chiefs goal for the month of November, which the Department will receive \$500 from National to be put into our Membership Account. To all the Membership Chairman in the District, continue to communicate and advise our State Membership PSC Michael Burke of any membership drives their Districts are having throughout the upcoming new year, again, this will allow the Department to aid the District Membership Chairmans with the required material and assistance they will need to have a successful membership drive. The hard work those Districts and Posts are putting forward in the Membership drives they are conducting is showing in their stats to date to reach our goal of 102% and build our numbers so our voice will continue to be strong to advocate before Congress and push our legislative goals we are fighting for.

Community Service Reports, Inspections, Quarterly reports, and District All-American Dashboard reporting: Inspections are coming along and being submitted to the Department Inspector slowly but surely. Looking at the Department Memstats, some of the District are doing an outstanding job getting their inspections completed and some Districts are moving along slowing to get them completed and forwarded to Department for approval. All the District Commanders know my goal this year is to have all the Inspections of the District and Posts completed by 31 December 2023.

Let's not forget about the importance of reporting information to the Department of New York and ensure they are entering their program information on the All-American Dashboard for Community Service, Voice of Democracy, Patriots Pen and Teachers.

Our National Commander-In-Chief has added 3 more categories for the State Commanders to be eligible for All American. These categories are listed below. If any post wants to submit an applicant to receive these awards, please submit your application to the Department of New York (Attn: State Adjutant) no later than 1 March 2024. These applications do not have to go through the District. Information, criteria and applications can be found on the National Website.

VFW MEMBER OF THE YEAR AWARD

This award is to recognize a member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars who has exemplified in their actions and accomplishments, the true spirit of our organization in serving the needs of their Post and Community, and who has dedicated themselves in a professional manner in addressing the Pillars of our Organization. This award is intended to recognize a member in good standing of the Veterans of Foreign Wars who has been a member a minimum of one full membership year. Award candidates holding any of the following elected or appointed offices during the award year are not eligible (Specifically -Commander, QM, Adjutant, Service Officer, or Chaplain). In addition, Past State Commanders and Past National Council members are ineligible from nomination. Please forward nominations for this award to Department of New York Headquarters, Attn: State Adjutant, by March 1, 2024.

VFW EMPLOYER OF THE YEAR AWARD

The Purpose of this Award is to confer recognition on one employer for outstanding records in the hiring and retention of



William "Doc" Schmitz PCIC, PSC

Past Commander in Chief William "Doc" Schmitz will be the VFW National Representative to the Department of New York VFW's Mid-Winter Council of Administration meeting that will be held at the Albany Marriott on January 12-13, 2024.

William "Doc" Schmitz was elected Commander in Chief of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the U.S. on July 24, 2019 at the 120th VFW National Convention in Orlando, Florida. Doc served in the United States Navy from 1961 to 170. He served in Vietnam as a corpsman attached the United Staes Marine Corps infantry and artillery. In recognition of his service he received the National Defense Service Medal, Vietnam Service Medal and the Republic of Vietnam Campaign Medal.

He joined the VFW in 1971 at Post 524 in Corning, NY, where he maintains his Gold Legacy Life membership. He has served as Department Commander, Post Commander, Southern Tier County Council Commander and District 5 Commander, Department Surgeon and editor of the New York State Overseas Veteran publication. He served at the national level as Surgeon General from 2010-2011 and as the Inspector General from 2015-2016.

This new Oral History Project is a 12-month project that commenced on October 20, 2023. PCI is sending out post cards and in some cases email messages to members requesting your participation in this project. The Postcard will bear the signature of State Commander Daniel Kell and will request that you call and complete an important verification of your membership data. When and if you call to verify/update your membership data you will be asked to participate in the "Oral History Publication Project". Calling to verify your membership data is completely voluntary on your part. When you call to verify your membership data, PCI will offer products for purchase (i.e., Digital or Hardbound Book Versions of the Oral History Project, Apparel, etc). I hope this provides clarification as our members receive the postcards and email messages. At the conclusion of the project, PCI will be providing the Department of New York with a comprehensive report and update of our membership data.

members, it's interests and the assets of the post. The by-laws of the Veterans of Foreign Wars spell out duties and responsibilities for each officer. However, most Posts elect the trustees as an afterthought. "There is nothing to this job!" Does this sound familiar??? Infact, the task of post trustee, is the most important position in your Post. Trustees are not responsible to the Commander, and not to the Quartermaster, but to the members of the Post. Their signature on the trustees' report indicate to the membership they have done their job with the intensity and exactness necessary to protect the Posts interests and assets as they would do for their own home. There is information online for the trustees to Complete their tasks. DO NOT RELY ON THE QUARTERMASTER TO COMPLETE TRUSTEE **REPORTS.**

The IRS with everything else uses electronic methods of tracking each person and or entity who should file tax returns and or 990 reports each year. If you do not complete, file and have accepted a 990 for 3 years, the IRS automatically suspends your not-for-profit status. You must reapply for that status. If you have any questions, please, contact a tax consultant for direction.



Don't be bitten by a Claim Shark! What is a "Claim Shark"?

- A Claim Shark is an individual or company that charges hefty fees to "assist" or "consult" veterans with filing their VA benefit claims – this practice is illegal!
- Claim Sharks are not VA accredited, meaning they aren't required to adhere to the wellestablished professional and ethical standards of VA accreditation, so their advice can often be misleading or even fraudulent.
- Like a "Loan Shark," once you're in, you can't get out, and may be subject to new and hidden fees whenever you get a new rating, no matter who does the work.



Some of their predatory practices are:

• Promising or guaranteeing an increased disability rating or percentage increase.

- Advertising expedited VA claims decisions.
- Requesting login credentials to access a veteran's personal information through secure VA websites like eBenefits or VA.gov.

• Using confusing tactics or ambiguous language to mislead claimants or coerce them into signing a contract.

• Telling veterans to forego VA exams and offering health consultations within their own network of doctors.

• Not providing access to Protected Health Information or Personal Identifiable Information.

- VA accredited veterans service organization representatives, like the VFW
- VA accredited claims agents
- VA accredited attorneys
- Attorneys assisting with Camp LeJeune lawsuits who do not charge excessive fees

Update on VA Home Loans

Helping Veterans and their families stay in their homes is a top priority at VA. Over the past year, we've been able to help more than 145,000 Veterans and their families retain their homes and avoid foreclosure. Even in the dynamic housing market of the last several years, rates of foreclosures of VA-backed mortgages are among the lowest in the country. And at the same time, we know that there are still Veterans struggling to make their payments.

To ensure these Veterans can stay in their homes, we are taking two steps:

1. We are calling on mortgage servicers to pause foreclosures of VA-guaranteed loans through May 31, 2024. During this pause we will work with servicers on workable home retention solutions for Veterans; and

2. We are extending the COVID-19 Refund Modification program through May 31, 2024. This extension will allow Veterans to obtain a zerointerest, deferred-payment loan from VA to cover missed payments and modify their existing VAguaranteed loan to achieve affordable monthly payments for the duration of this extension.

By pausing foreclosures and extending the COVID-19 Refund Modification program, we can continue assisting Veterans with their loans while we launch our newest home retention option, the VA Servicing Purchase (VASP) program. Through VASP, VA will purchase defaulted VA loans from mortgage servicers, modify the loans, and then place them in the VA-owned portfolio as direct loans. This will empower us to work with Veterans experiencing severe financial hardship to adjust their loans – and their monthly payments – so they can keep their homes.

We want every Veteran with a loan to know that VA is here to help – and we encourage any Veteran who is struggling with making their payments to visit us at <u>www.va.gov/housing-assistance</u> or call us at 877-827-3702. We have loan technicians working with Veterans to help them stay in their homes, including discussing available home retention options such as repayment plans, special forbearance, loan modification, and more. And we will continue to actively review our portfolio of loans and work with loan servicers to do everything in our power to keep all Veterans and survivors with a VA-guaranteed mortgage in their homes.

Greetings from your National Council Member!

I hope everyone had an enjoyable summer and for some, winter arrived a little earlier than expected. Although winter is before us, there are still some pleasant days where many of us can continue to work towards that 102% membership goal as well and getting on the road to complete those post inspections to reach the State of Commander's goal having inspections completed by December 31st. With the holiday season approaching, it is a great time to coordinate a recruiting event in many of the malls and larger shops where traffic will be heavy with shoppers.

With regard to inspections, one requirement of note that has been in the Manual of Procedure Ritual for some time requires all posts to have local bylaws. There is available to you on the Department of NY website at <u>www.vfwny.org</u> under Resources, reports and forms a template that provides a basis from which post bylaws can be prepared. Failure to have local bylaws can result in a post's inspection not being accepted as satisfactory. Also, as a reminder, when a post inspection is forwarded to the Department for review by the State Inspector there must be attached a complete copy of the latest IRS 990 or an acceptance email for those filing the 990 postcard form; a copy of the latest Trustee Report of Audit properly completed and signed by the three trustees that are listed on the Post Election Report and a copy of the post bond.

The review process should be in full swing for the Voice of Democracy, Patriots Pen and Teacher Programs. That being said, now is the time to start preparing nominations for the Civil Servant Awards Program. Nominations can be made in the following categories:

- VFW National Law Enforcement Award
- VFW National Firefighter Award
- VFW National Emergency Medical Technician Award
- VFW National 911 Dispatcher Award
- VFW National Explosive Ordnance Disposal Technician (E.O.D.T.) Award

As many of you may know, a number of changes have been made regarding Buddy Poppy ordering which became effective August 1, 2023. National has provided the following guidance regarding Poppy orders:

1) Orders must be sent to the Departments where orders will belaced through the On-Line Membership System (OMS).

2) All poppies are hipped within 10 days of ordering except orders placed in June and July, due to preparation for National Convention, please allow an additional five business days.

3) All orders for the traditional Buddy Poppy, Anniversary Poppies or tin tab poppies must be placed through the Department and Auxiliaries must go through their Post to order all poppies.

4) The tabs **do count** towards the Buddy Poppy requirement for the All-American program.

5) If you do not receive your order within four weeks of placing it with the Department, please contact Amanda at Department Headquarters who will assist you in determining the status of your order. Do not call National to inquire.

6) If you do not report a missing order within 90 days of processing, the order will **NOT** be replaced free of charge, and you will have to resubmit your order.

There has not been a National Council of Administration Meeting (C of A) since last reporting to you following my visit to National in August; however, National has been very busy. National is moving forward with its Department Inspection initiative for the 2023-24 term and have plans to complete ten inspections this year. I just returned from inspecting the Department of Indiana myself and the program is well underway.

Administrative Operations at National is engaged in 10 Article IX Disciplinary Actions, 12 administrative actions and 10 membership eligibility challenges. There are 50 Posts currently under suspension and at the present time there are 5,6664 chartered posts.

Our next National C of A will be in early March when I head out to Kansas City for the Voice of Democracy and Patriot Pen Awards during the Legislative Conference scheduled for 3-7 March 2023. Until my next report, I wish you and your families a very Merry Christmas, Happy Hanukkah and Happy New Year!



VFW Employer of the Year Award Nomination Form



The Purpose of Award: To confer recognition on one employer for outstanding records in the hiring and retention of veterans.

Deadline: The deadline for submission of nominations of employers of veterans is March 1, 2024 to Department Headquarters. Nominations received after that date will not be eligible for consideration for the national award.

Procedure: Nominations from Departments must be sent to National headquarters via this form only. Nominations that arrive without supporting information will not be eligible for the national awards

Only those nominations that include adequate documentation on the nominee's employment
practices concerning veterans will be considered for the National VFW Employer of the Year
Awards. The nominator should provide a copy of the company's written policy on employment of
veterans if available, a description of how the employer supports veterans' activities in the
community, and any other reasons why the nominee should be selected to be the Employer of
the year Award winner. Governmental agencies are not eligible for an award.

Award: The National Winner will receive a plaque to be presented by the National Commander at the Annual National convention and will receive a trip to travel to the convention city to accept the award.


Judging Criteria:

- Identify and describe the employer's programs and or benefits designed to recruit veterans, including innovative business practices used to increase veteran recruitment (10 points)
- Describe the employer's policies that give a preference to hire veterans, referring veterans, or any other veteran policy (VA veteran sick leave hours). Provide the positive and significant impacts these policies have on the employer's business results. (10 Points)
- Describe the employer's policies or initiatives that improve the current and future veteran employer's career opportunities. (10 points)
- Provide the number of veterans employed, the total number of employees, and the percentage of veterans employed during a set time period: 1 January 2023 to December 31st, 2024. (20 points)
- Describe collaborative efforts with business organizations, educational partners, and community
 organizations that improve veteran employment opportunities. (10 points)
- 6. Explain why veterans would choose this employer over other employers. (10 points)
- Provide documented endorsements, newspaper articles, awards, or letters of support highlighting the nominee's contributions to veteran friendly employment or retention. (10 points)
- 8. Provide the number of veterans employed with the employer for over one year. (10 points)
- 9. Provide the number of veterans employed with the employer for five years. (10 points)

VFW award for special recognition of outstanding achievement and exceptional leadership for Junior ROTC Cadets. This award seeks to recognize a remarkable cadet who will become a leader in their community and serve their country.

Criteria for the award:

Possession of individual characteristics contributing to leadership including:

- A. Positive attitude toward the JROTC program
- B. Outstanding military bearing and conduct both in and out of uniform
- C. Personal attributes (self-confidence, initiative, flexibility, judgement).

D. Patriotism (commander or member of color guard, drill team with or without arms, flag protocol instruction team, and actively promote Americanism). Shows devotion to school, community, America. An individual who practices service through repeated acts of support.

E. Courtesy (dependability, punctuality, human relations, respect, cooperation).

F. Growth potential (capable of assuming high leadership responsibilities in JROTC Unit with additional training and experience).

- G. Demonstrated leadership potential, military bearing, and scholastic achievement.
- Attainment of a grade of "B" in JROTC with an overall average of "C" in all subjects for the

- Nominee encourages members of the Community to support VFW programs and continually encourages others to become members.
- Nominee must have been submitted for #StillServing campaign recognition at https://todaysvfw.org/

Let me begin by thanking everyone who encouraged, collaborated, and successfully worked with teachers, schools and the students in this year's Voice of Democracy program. It has been a privilege and pleasure to work with you. Your hard work paid off with increased participation and outstanding essays sent for judging. Thank you to our district commanders and ladies' auxiliaries that helped their posts enormously to promote and sponsor the students. It is a huge task and great teamwork.

The theme selected this year the is: "WHAT ARE THE GREATEST ATTRIBUTES OF OUR DEMOCRACY". Competition is open to grades 9-12 with an application, attached printed version of the essay, flash drive with audio essay. Points are awarded for originality, content development, and voice quality.

This year's submissions to National will be, through a student app, checked for generated AI essays. AI is being used increasingly by schools. AI plagiarism - 100% AI generated essays will be eliminated, going to next in ranking by the judges.

To the District VOD chairmen, you need to send a photo of the student along with their application, essay, and flash drive. You must send me the following completed forms: Voice of Democracy Report Form and the Voice of Democracy summary report indicating the number of participants, number of winners, scholarships awarded, additional expenses from the various posts that participated in the district you represent.

Please be aware that the submitting post must fill in their appropriate sections such as numbers participating, number of winners, scholarships awarded and additional expenses recorded. Please see that the information submitted by the students are correct and completed and signed. Districts MUST submit their numbers to me. They can be mailed to me at 10 Rokeby Rd, Red Hook, NY 12571.

On a district level, many were submitted without being judged on the local level. There was an overall increase in the number of students participating. Worked with many students to locate posts that could sponsor their entry. It was a pleasure to work with various post commanders to make it successful. The students/parents were most appreciative to have this opportunity. The quality of the submitted essays was outstanding making for a lively conversation in judging in my District 2 competition.

Forms need to be to me by Dec. 20th deadline with submissions. NYS State competition is Dec. 30, 2023, in Red Hook, NY. at 1pm. All entries following the competition will be sent to Bob Mitchell, State Adjutant, for preparation for the VFW National Championship. We look forward to the NYS competition on December 30, 2023. Judging will be held at the



As per the information on all inspections being completed by 12/31/2023 that was given at the June 2023 Dept Convention and at the 3 Dept OTI's held a couple months ago, I am worried we aren't going to complete our State Commanders directive. I need all District Commanders to push your inspection teams to get the Post Inspections completed.

We have already allowed the Posts without Post bylaws to have them completed and signed prior to inspection next year.

The following are important to having your inspections accepted: trustee report of audit must be filled out correctly. The total funds must match the reconciliation of cash and investments, thus the reconciliation of cash and investment section must be filled in. All 3 trustee signatures must be filled in by the 3 elected trustees, not printed in by the Post Commander or Quartermaster. Copy of the Post Bond must be attached, and the Bond MUST be greater than the total funds available on the trustee report and has to be a SURETY Bond. Bonds are available through the Department and the form and rates can be found athttps:// vfwny.com/uploads/documents/2023-2024/23-24OfficerBond.pdf. Posts can NOT self-inspect and then submit the inspection report to the

As of December 1, 2023, there are still more than 81,000 American service members whose remains have not been recovered: WW II - 72,135; Korea -7,485; Vietnam - 1,578; Cold War - 126; the Gulf War -5; El Dorado Canyon - 1. As long as there is one service member still unaccounted for the mission of DPPA will be to continue to search and recover the remains of our mussing and be returned home for a proper military burial. Every day of the year we must continue to promote and bring awareness to the importance of the POW/MIA issues in our communities and with our Legislators by setting up the Missing Man Table, not only at our post but with the permission of our local businesses to set one up at their establishment.

DPAA recently accounted for: Sgt. Richard Hammond, New Hampshire, WWII, Army, 601 Tank Destroyer, date accounted for - September 5, 2023; 2nd Lt. Kenyan Brindley, Arkansas, WWII, Army, 703 Bombardment Squad, Germany, date accounted for – September 21, 2023; SSgt. Robert Ferris, New York, WWII, Army Air Corp, 401 Bombardment Squad, France, date accounted for – September 22, 2023; PHM2 Merle Hillman, California, Navy, Hawaii, date accounted for – October 20, 2023; Army Pfc. Clinton Smith Jr., WW II was accounted for November 9, 2023; Army Air Corp Pfc. Henry McConnell, WWII, accounted for – November 8, 2023; Army Cpl. William Herrington, Korean War accounted for November 9, 2023.

These remains were sent to the DPAA Laboratory at Offutt Air Force Base, Nebraska for examination and identification. I will keep you posted on burial information as it becomes available. You may also call the Army Casualty Office for inquires at (800) 892-2490
